DISPLAY MERGES THE WORLDS OF VISUAL ART AND CONTEMPORARY CIRCUS

The concept of the show is the building of an art exhibition on stage. In the hands of two jugglers, both the arrangement of artworks and the mechanisms used to display them become the material of the performance itself. These elements enter light, poetic, and comical situations, leading toward an exhibition that the audience can later observe up close. The show is accompanied by live music from Konsta Leinonen and concludes as the exhibition opens for the audience to explore.

The artistic process is rooted in material-based and embodied research: an intuitive exploration in which each object contributes its own simple, physical presence to the performance's aesthetics and dramaturgy. Every movement, grip, and swing forms a subtle dialogue between body and material.

By bringing the refined and distinctive interactions between objects and bodies, which are characteristic of Nuua's work, into the realm of visual art, the piece offers a different way of seeing art. It is not presented as a finished image, form, or statement, but as a constantly evolving process in which beauty, uncertainty, and a touch of absurd humor exist side by side.

The performance may open unexpected landscapes in the viewer's mind. Surprising interactions between objects and bodies stimulate the imagination and encourage reflection on personal perceptions of movement and art.

The piece is designed to be experienced in theatre spaces, museums or open indoor places. Our intention is to bring together venues, artists and audiences from fine art and contemporary circus.

DISPLAY GALLERY



Display Gallery is a collection of works that looks at different aspects of being human: how we connect with one another, what we value, how we care, how we play, how we try to understand ourselves, and how we deal with things that are temporary.

The works emerge directly from the performance. Each piece is either built, revealed or transformed through movement, choreography and interaction during the performance, creating a physical and conceptual journey from the stage into the exhibition.

The gallery is an extension of the performance: a space where the movement stops, the objects remain, and the audience is invited to continue the journey on their own.

NUUA COMPANY

Nuua Company is a Finnish contemporary circus and visual theater group founded in 2013. With Its Experimental works, Nuua has redeemed its place in the international performing arts scene

On its ten-year journey, Nuua Company has been selected for a Circus next program. Nuua's award-winning performances have received notable mentions from critics and books about the contemporary circus, and the performances have been touring in 21 countries.

Nuua wants to provide a safe environment for creative work where one can question the norms of the circus, learn new skills, and contribute to the process in a collaborative way that makes each creation rich and adventurous.

Nuua renews juggling as object theater, concepts connecting body and object movements, and explores circus techniques as tools of expression.



Depending on the viewer's personal experiences, our multilayered performances open up to everyone differently. We are awakening the emotions, imagination, and sensitivity into an empowered state where experientiality precedes narratives, and the spectator becomes more receptive to new dreamlike experiences.

ALL DREAMS __ OK __.

In an age of disposable consumption, we rarely take the time to repair broken objects. Once damaged, they are often seen as useless, unwanted, and without value. In Western culture, the worth of collectible objects is still closely tied to their rarity and condition. But could there also be value in wear, scars, and imperfection?

The Japanese art of kintsugi, meaning golden joinery, offers another perspective. For centuries, broken ceramics have been repaired with natural lacquer and their cracks highlighted with gold. Rather than hiding damage, kintsugi celebrates it, transforming each repaired object into a unique piece, both rare and whole.

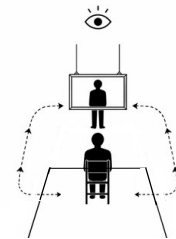

WILT is a small thing left behind. Something temporary has been given a place and it's slowly transforming already.

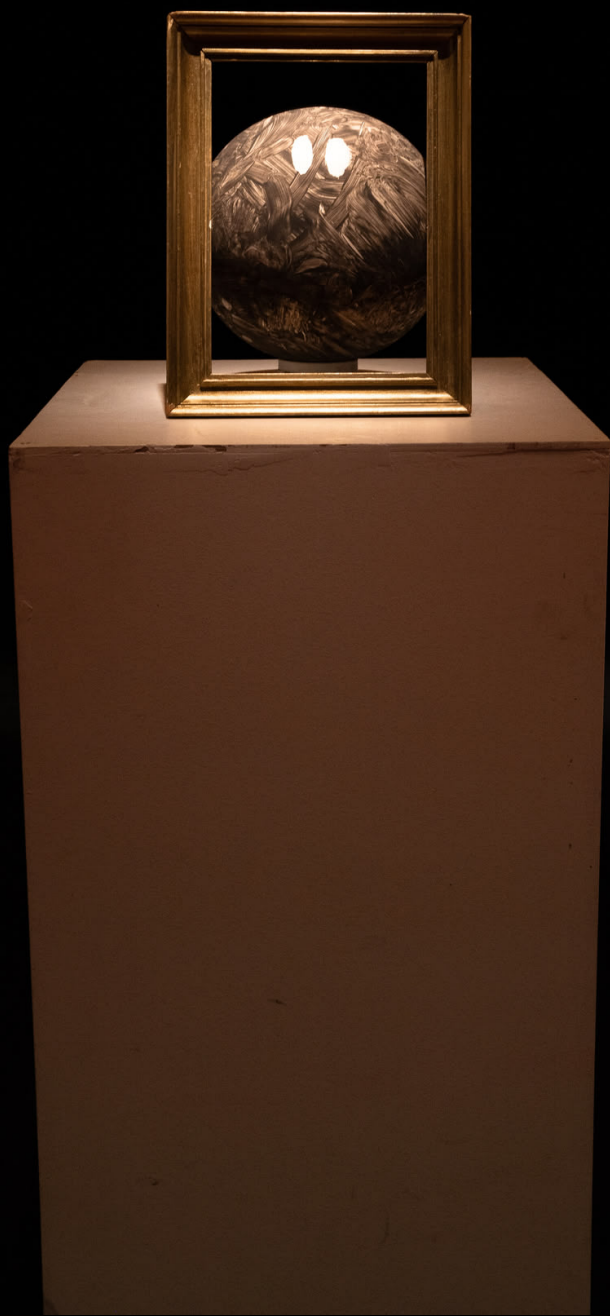

It's almost like a companion species.

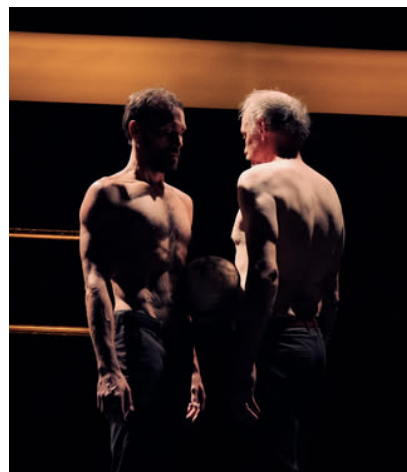
Babies reach for it before they can speak, children invent games with it, adults organize societies around it, nations identify with it, billion-dollar industries depend on it.

Consept & performing

Performer, director and founder of Nuua Company, Olli Vuorinen graduated from Académie Fratellini, France, in 2011. He received two awards at the Cirque de Demain Festival, and Nuua was selected for the EU-funded CircusNext project in 2012. He has also worked in short film productions and received 6 years of Finnish state artist grants.

Alongside Nuua, Vuorinen has collaborated with numerous circus and physical theatre companies and toured in over 20 countries. He is known for his distinctive performance style, innovative juggling techniques and work with object theatre.



Sampo Kurppa (on stage)
Consept & performing

Sampo Kurppa is a circus artist, physical theatre performer, and has a bit of an actor's streak. With 20 years of performing experience, he works across various art forms and productions of different scales.

He is drawn to comedy, movement, and object manipulation. Everyday actions, observing people, and his own clumsiness are among his greatest inspirations. In performance, he aims to capture the feeling of controlling a derailed train. In time, meverything slips into control.



Konsta Leinonen (on stage/visible)

Finnish musician Konsta Leinonen fuses his experience working with film, recording studios and multiple performative arts to find new ways to bring his perception of (post-)modern living into sound and music.

Leinonen merges live instrumentation with highly dynamic hands-on electronics and has a fascination for new technological frontiers via generative AI music & multimedia. Leinonen enjoys working closely with artists to reach a consistent, shared artistic vision.



Teo Lanerva
Lighting design

Teo Lanerva is a freelance lighting and video designer (MA, Theatrical Arts) based in Helsinki, Finland. He works with contemporary performances, concerts and events ranging from small underground clubs to festivals.

He has been granted a säde-award and his designs have been performed in more than ten countries. Lanerva's recent works include all Nuua Company creations and choreographer Mikko Niemistö's solo Odd Meters at Zodiak, opera FLASH FLASH composed by Juhani Nuorvala at Musica Nova Festival, and light art piece Liquid Line at Lux Helsinki.



Thomas Monckton
Consept of dramaturge

Thom Monckton is a circus artist, filmmaker and director born in New Zealand, Thom trained in circus in Christchurch and physical theatre at Jacques Lecoq in Paris.

His performances have toured to over 30 different countries with every solo show presented at Edinburgh Fringe (The Artist, Only Bones v1.0, and The Pianist) being nominated for the Total Theatre Awards. Thom's debut solo show Moving Stationery won six awards across three festivals and garnered him Actor of The Year 2012 in Wellington's Theatre Awards.



Inka Pehkonen
Outside eye

Inka Pehkonen is a Finnish circus artist based in Berlin. She graduated from Lahti Professional Circus Education in 2015 and is co-founder of SISUS, working as a performer, director and producer. Together with Imogen Huzel, she is also co-founder and artistic director of Based on Kimberly.

Inka has toured to over 20 countries and collaborated across circus and other performing arts with artists and companies including Cirkus Cirkör, Sanja Kosonen & L'Avant-Courrier, Burnt Out Punks, Clowns Without Borders Sweden and Agit Cirk.

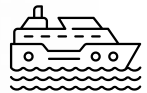
